Wisconsin Veterans Village Mural

A brief history of the founding of Wisconsin Veterans Village. In 2017, Tom Wiltzius of Appleton was unable to find senior living for his mom, a veteran of World War II. Looking for a solution, he connected with Outagamie County Housing Authority, and a plan was proposed.

At the Outagamie County Housing Authority Glenpark Campus, buildings that housed students at the Fox Valley Technical College, had the potential to be repurposed as affordable housing for veterans.

To implement the change, Wiltzius formed a nonprofit organization, Wisconsin Veterans Village Association (wisvva.org). To further the project, the Outagamie County Housing Authority agreed that the association would be able to purchase the facility once 80% of the apartments became vacant as part of natural attrition.

The apartments would be remodeled as they became available. On May 1st, 2023 Wisconsin Veterans Village began operating the complex as a facility devoted to affordable housing for veterans.

In 2021 however; A mural was commissioned, Spenser Young was chosen as the artist, his signature is in the lower right-hand corner, signed Forever Young. The inspiration for the mural, is our co-founders' mother, alongside many other tremendous women who served our country. Every day we are reminded of the tremendous courage of women, who are veterans, and their fight for equality, as they fought our nations wars. It is worth noting that every painted picture, is that of a real person, that served in the military. Original photos were provided by Kim Massey and Pat Lovesee for Steve Young to depict.

Tom Wiltzius served in the Army. on active duty in Vietnam 1969-1970 with the 36th Signal Battalion at Long Binh Vietnam. He earned a Bachelor's, Master's, and a PHD degree in Counseling and Guidance at UW Madison while at Fox Valley Technical College, serving as a college counselor. Tom also served 15 more years in the Army Reserves attaining the rank of Major, as an officer, while serving in the Public Affairs Office. Tom's story can be seen online via the Library of Congress' Veterans History Project. Tom is not featured in the mural, and currently resides in Florida.

Lilian Wiltzius (Pictured in the lower right- hand corner) Tom's mother, served In the Army / Air Force Core, in World War II, stationed at Enid Army Air Base in Enid Oklahoma, as an Aircraft Dispatcher. Later in 1981, Lilian started the MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving) here in the Fox Valley, and another close friend who both lost daughters to drunk drivers. Tom helped found the Fox Valley MADD chapter.

Norbert Resheske (Pictured in the lower left-hand corner) was Tom's Father-in-law, he served in the pacific, as a Medic during WW II. He is said to be a great story teller. It was unknown if the stories he told were based in truth or embellished tales of his military experiences.

Daughters of the American Revolution Welcome Home Pinning Ceremony

On Wednesday April 23rd, @ 12 pm The Daughters of the American Revolution will be holding it's final Welcome Home Pinning Ceremony. In 2012 President Barack Obama and Congress established the Vietnam War Commemoration program to recognize the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War. The 13-year-long Vietnam War Commemoration enlists Commemorative Partner organizations at the local, state and national levels to conduct pinning events and activities that honor 6.2 million Vietnam War-era veterans who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces at any time from Nov. 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975, regardless of duty location, and their 9 million family members.

The DAR, founded in 1890 and headquartered in Washington, D.C., is a non-profit, nonpolitical volunteer women's service organization dedicated to promoting patriotism, preserving American history, and securing America's future through better education for children. The Daughters of the Wisconsin Society volunteer thousands of service hours a year in these missions. Through membership, we are focused on family genealogy and share a passion for history, remembering our Revolutionary War Patriot ancestors.
